



Dulaney District Cub Scout Day Camp 2010 100 Years of Scouting

YOUTH CREW INFORMATION:

First of all, thank you in advance for assisting us with our Day Camp. We will be providing approximately 500 Cub Scouts with a week of Day Camp experience this summer. Hopefully, you may use the volunteer time towards advancement in your Scout rank, but if not, the volunteer time can count towards graduation requirements for volunteering. We will send out letters after camp detailing your volunteer hours (Please provide any additional paperwork for us to complete if the letter on letterhead will not suffice).

For the past several years, only Scouts age 14 or over were able to assist us in the running of our Program Areas, i.e. Sports, Scout Skills, Fishing, Adventure, Crafts, Science, Staff Assistants, etc, while we tapped the resources of the younger Scouts as Den Aides to assist the Den Leaders in running the Dens and moving the boys from Station to Station. These younger scouts were required to be placed with boys from their Natural Pack, resulting in some Dens with many Den Aides and some Dens with none.

With the changes this year to our National Accreditation Standards, we are now able to use all Boy Scouts both as a member of our Youth Crew with a Den or as a member of our Station Crew at a Station. This year we will assign all youth crew to work at stations. We will only assign youth crew to a den at the request of a camp den leader. The Youth Crew Chief will place the youth based on their preference on the application combined with his assessment of their scouting experience and ability to handle the responsibilities of assisting at a Station.

Girls age 14 and older may also register as a member of our Youth Crew and will be assigned to assist at one of our Day Camp Stations.

Girls under 14 and Boys under 14 not registered as a Boy Scout are not able to be members of our Youth Crew. They must attend Junior Camp and may **NOT** use the Youth Crew form.

The Dulaney District Cub Scout Day Camp (Theme: Cubs in Space) will be held as follows:

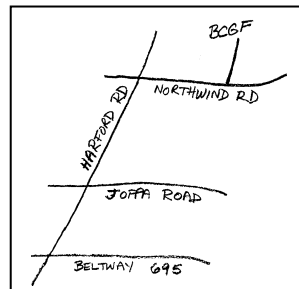
When: June 21st - 25th, 2010 7:45 a.m. - 4:20 p.m. daily Camp begins at 8:00 a.m. sharp!
July 12th - 16th, 2010 7:45 a.m. - 4:20 p.m. daily Camp begins at 8:00 a.m. sharp!

Where: Baltimore County Game and Fish Protective Association at 3400 Northwind Road (21234)

Directions: From the Beltway (695), take Harford Road going North (approx. 2 miles), turn right on Northwind Road and go approx. 0.6 miles to the camp on your left.

All volunteers must park in the BGE Field beyond the BB Range.
